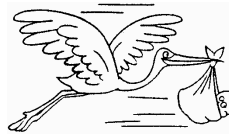

As we head into a new year, exciting events and planning are happening in our Collaborative!

- ◆ In January, both Parish Councils will now join together as a Collaborative Pastoral Council.
- ◆ Below you will find information about a presentation by the Kid's Healthy Minds Initiative from Franciscan Children's.

The Kids Healthy Minds Initiative (KHMI) is an innovative mental health awareness and community education program offered across the Archdiocese of Boston in partnership with mental health experts from Franciscan Children's.

The prevalence of youth mental illness is staggering. In the US, 20% of children and adolescents have mental health diagnosis. Failure to detect and treat mental illness early can have a significant impact on a child's potential and success later in life.

Parishioners and community members who participate in a KHMI education session will gain an understanding of the early warning signs of mental illness, common youth diagnoses and tips for how to eliminate the stigma that is often associated with mental illness and its treatments.

Franciscan Children's will provide an education session for the St. Bernadette/St. Mary Collaborative on Sunday January 20th at St. Mary's Church Hall at 2 pm.

Please join our faith community to learn about this crucial initiative and what steps we can take together to support our youth and their families who are challenged by mental illness.

Collaborative Plan Writing Team

Beginning in May, a team representing both St. Bernadette and St. Mary will join together to formulate and write a plan of goals we wish to accomplish for the next three years as a Collaborative. Each member of the team has committed to not only attending the plan writing meetings but to attend three workshops before we begin. Those workshops are: Forming Disciples, Forming Leaders and Forming Collaboratives. These three workshops are offered by the Archdiocese of Boston and are open to all parishioners free of charge. The actual Plan Writing Team will begin meeting in May. This team will be meeting, updating parishioners about their discussions and continuing until we have a completed set of goals that we feel are the most important to accomplish over three years.
