The Parish Office hours are 9am until 3pm Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Office closed on Friday.



May 5 ~ Third Sunday of Easter

In the first reading, St. Paul is ordered "to stop teaching in that name." That is, he was to stop teaching about Jesus. But Paul gives a clear response, "We must obey God rather than men." Paul was willing to face trial and suffering rather than stop speaking about Jesus. The gospel presents us with the magnificent story of Jesus' love and mercy. Having denied Jesus three times, Jesus now gives Peter three opportunities to show his love. We can hear the strength of that love in each response, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Are you willing to speak with the same conviction we hear in Paul and Peter?

Pastor's Message

Reflections on the Third Sunday of Easter

In today's gospel we see how the disciples were having self-doubts about their abilities. Please notice how Jesus reassured them as He knew they needed more understanding of their roles and mission. He assures them of forgiveness and lets them know that He will be there to guide them. Through Jesus' understanding and patience, they are reassured in their mission and in who they are. What message does this gospel have for us today? Like Peter, each one of us needs to have the courage to follow Jesus. The triple command of Jesus to Peter shows that our love for God and God's love for us is most powerfully revealed when we give to others the gifts that God gives to us. Obedience to God and love of God comes before everything else. Sometimes in doing this we will be going against the way of the world or popular opinion. We, too, are reassured of Jesus' forgiveness and understanding as well as His presence with us always because of the Eucharist.
