

## Pastor's Message

### Reflections on Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ:

Today we celebrate the very wonderful feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. When we receive the Eucharist, how do we see and experience ourselves being nourished and enriched by God? Do we remember what happens at Mass, and do we connect this experience with all of life? Our spiritual hungers are the greatest hungers of all. We need food for our spiritual journey. We are journeying in faith toward the promised land of eternal life. Jesus gives us His Body and Blood to satisfy our every longing and help us on this journey. He loves us so much that He wishes to be part of us and we be part of Him. We are reminded of the Lord that Jesus showed this even as He was dying on the Cross. The Eucharist heals our brokenness. One of the greatest blessings of being a people of the Eucharistic community, in addition to receiving our Lord, is the joy of being able to sustain and nurture this experience through daily prayer and the lived faith experience. Prayer leads us into a deeper realization of God acting in our lives and the healing and loving moments of the Eucharist.

Each time we receive the Eucharist we can do it consciously and with grateful hearts mindful of the awesome reality of being loved and of receiving the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. We can feed on the very Body and Blood of Jesus longing to be more faithful to our baptismal promises and to unite ourselves to God. The Eucharist is Jesus' promise to always be with us. Jesus is with us in the Eucharist to remind each of us that we are invited to enter into an unbroken relationship with the Trinity. Our sharing in the Body and Blood of Jesus is not just for ourselves. Through the Eucharist we are called to be more like Christ. We are called to transformation and this transformation is both a gift and a challenge. Jesus gives fully of Himself in the Eucharist and calls us to do the same for others. In receiving the Eucharist, may we always give praise to God and ask God for divine assistance in whatever ways needed.

We are the Area Agency on Aging and Aging Service access point for the communities of Braintree, Cohasset, Hingham, Holbrook, Hull, Milton, Norwell, Quincy, Randolph, Scituate and Weymouth. South Shore Elder Services provides services, support, information, resources and advocacy for elders enabling them to remain independent and at home.

Many of our programs here at South Shore Elders rely on the dedication and hard work of volunteers. Among these is our Meals on Wheels program, which provides hot and nutritious meals to over 1,200 homebound elders every day. In addition to delivering a hot meal, our volunteers provide a safety check for our consumers who may not otherwise see anyone else during the day. We are reaching out as we are in immediate, critical need for **VOLUNTEERS** to deliver Meals on Wheels in your community.

Being a volunteer with the Meals on Wheels Program provides a rewarding opportunity for our volunteers and a vital service for those who are homebound, sometimes isolated, often frail, and who are especially at risk during the summer weather. Meals on Wheels are available to anyone who meets the eligibility criteria, regardless of income.

SSes currently has opportunities available with delivering meals or assisting at one of our local meal sites in Randolph. Randolph Meal Site Wheels is looking for a drivers for Monday - Friday for delivering meals. Meals are delivered in the morning between the hours of 10:00 AM and noon.
