## Pastor's Message

### Reflections on the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The story of Martha and Mary gives to each of us ample material to reflect upon. How well do we really listen or ever slow down to let the Lord speak to us through the Eucharist, His words, through others or through daily events? God is very present in the most ordinary moments in our lives. So many times people who are special to us stop by to see us. When the list of people who are special to us expands, so does our understanding of the presence of God in our lives. How often are we so busy talking that we forget to listen in conversation, in prayer, in so many other ways? How many times do we do so much or think we do so much for others that moments of visits just pass us by? Some people let the summer go by without taking time to enjoy it. Some people let life go by without taking time to enjoy it. Summer is a good time to ask some necessary questions about the really serious issues of life -- like the true meaning of life? The God who loves us reveals to us these deeper dimensions of life. Sometimes the message of Jesus goes by and we do not take time to be enriched by His message. The readings today are encouraging us to take the time to see who the Lord is calling us to be. For one day each of us might consider letting go of our things to do list. Is there anything in life that we need to let go of to slow down?

#### Feast of St. Martha

What's on your calendar this week?

On July 29th, we celebrate the feast of St. Martha, unofficial patron of workaholics and busybodies everywhere.

Martha appears several times in Scripture. One passage we heard in our recent Sunday Gospel: Jesus has visited the home of Martha and Mary. Mary sits at the feet of our Lord, soaking in his teaching. In the meantime, Martha is washing dishes, preparing hors d'oeuvres, and playing the hostess. Sound familiar? John's Gospel doesn't shy away from Martha's active nature either. After the death of their brother Lazarus, Martha is the first to greet Jesus, and while she's quite confident in Jesus' power to heal, she's the first to warn him of the possible smell should the tomb be opened. While Mary often gets the credit for contemplative holiness, we can't forget that pragmatic is a saint, too! As we strive to place Jesus in the right perspective, making him king of our hearts and over all our daily tasks, we can know that we're in good company. St. Martha, pray for us!
