Reflections on the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

With the coming of Labor Day weekend, our hearts turn to the busyness of the fall. The fall season is going to be very busy. What big plans do each of us have for the fall? The readings today remind us that we can be more attentive to the lonely people whom are among us and whom we know. There are people we have all overlooked. We know the importance of seeing all people as equal in the kingdom of God and in God's eyes. The readings today raise the issue of how do we welcome people into our lives. 
