Reflections on the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Readings today are encouraging us to reflect upon the meaning of living a life of gratitude. Each time we ask Jesus for something, do we ever say thank you or ask for forgiveness? One thing each of us might consider is to think of fifteen or twenty ways that the Lord has blessed us. The gift of life, the gift of family, the gift of faith, and the sacraments are some of the truly great gifts that God has given to each of us. The first gift that each of us experience from God is the gift of life. For the gift of life we owe thanks to God for this along with others.

Do we ever respond like one of the lepers who did not say thank you? How often do we turn to God and say thank you for the various healings we have received in life? As part of saying thank you to God for blessings received from Him, we are called to share what we have with others and speak of the ways that God has blessed us. Thankfulness to God is the start of what worship and life are all about. The Eucharist is the great prayer of Thanksgiving.

RESPECT LIFE

It is my prayer that each of us will be looking for ways we can show others the importance of respecting life and letting people know how much we are loved by God and that we are made in the image and likeness of God. Opening our hearts to life has been a constant theme of the teachings of all of the popes including Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis. Cardinal Sean O'Malley has constantly spoken of the importance of the sacredness of life and has encouraged each of us to truly help others to understand that all are made in the image and likeness of God. May each of us be channels of God's mercy by celebrating what the gift of life means to us.

DISCIPLES IN MISSION

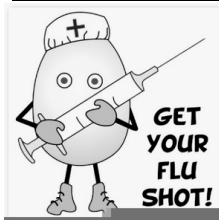
Patty O'Connor is the Coordinator of our Collaborative Disciples in Mission.

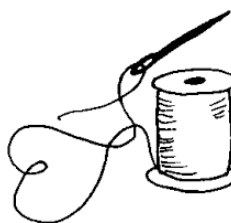


Randolph Pharmacy will hold a flu clinic in our church hall on Sunday, October 20th after all the Masses. Please bring your insurance card with you.
