**Pastor's  
Message**

Reflections on the Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings today highlight the universal love and mercy of God. God is the one who makes us worthy of salvation. Do we feel a need for the presence of Jesus in our lives? My dear friends, one of the most important part of the readings today is that Jesus, in his wisdom, often challenged people to a different perspective on what they needed to do with their lives. Zacchaeus went looking for Jesus because he knew that he needed to change. Despite being wealthy, Zacchaeus was a lonely, unhappy man who was considered an outcast. The mission of Jesus is to save those who are lost. Today's gospel shows the compassion that Jesus had toward Zacchaeus and all sinners.

Zacchaeus had heard that Jesus was friendly, and he wanted to find out. He ran and hurried to see Jesus. Zacchaeus saw his need for Jesus in his heart. It is suggested that some people did not think that Zacchaeus even deserved mercy. Jesus showed Zacchaeus how much He cared about him. Zacchaeus responded by being desirous to make restitution for the people he had offended. The example of Zacchaeus shows us that we also need to ask Jesus for forgiveness and help. Jesus also shows us that He is always willing to go the extra mile to help us. Encountering Jesus must lead to a faith experience that brings greater meaning to our relationship with Jesus and greater meaning and goodness to our lives. This includes a greater awareness of the way that God has blessed us and of our own sinfulness.

Zacchaeus was very conscious when he was with Jesus about his wealth and wished to make amends if he had defrauded anyone. This raises the interesting question of how we use our time, talents, and treasures. Are our time, talent, and treasures used in such a way as to bring us closer to Jesus and to others, or does it keep us apart from Jesus and others? Does the way we use our blessings bring us to a happier state or not? We have opportunities to help others and ourselves. Right now our Grand Annual may be such an opportunity. We can really use your help. Like Zacchaeus there are things that we need to let go and ways to reach out to others to be happier. Thank you.
