## Pastor's Message

### Reflections on the Baptism of the Lord.

The Christmas Season concludes with today's feast. The image of the Spirit moving over Jesus and the water suggests that the new time just beginning is a new creation or a re-creation of the world for so indeed it is. Please understand that the Baptism by John is a baptism of repentance, and the baptism instituted by Jesus would be sacramental and a rebirth. Notice how God the Father is so pleased with His Son, Jesus, God the Son. The baptism that Jesus spoke about is a sacrament that communicates to people a whole new life, making us spiritually alive in Jesus. In Baptism and all the sacraments, God dwells within us. Baptism is about self-giving that each of us is called to with the indwelling of the Spirit. We give of ourselves for the good of the others. Do we share with others what we have received from God, and do we understand how this is an ongoing gift? When we truly appreciate the gift of the Spirit, we uphold our own personal dignity, and we are so desirous to act to enrich the lives of others. How do we translate into our lived experience a deep reverence for the Sacrament of Baptism in such a way so that others may experience that all are called to eternity with the Father? The Eucharist each week helps us to appreciate the real presence of Jesus in all of the sacraments and our need for each other. In our collaborative, we are so blessed because we all come from different places in God's world, different cultures, and we share one great common desire to live the blessings of our sacramental baptism.
