**Reflections on The
Presentation of the Lord**

The feast of Jesus' Presentation at the temple 40 days after His birth focuses on a special moment in the life of the Holy Family. Mary and Joseph, according to the dictates of Mosaic Law, took the baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to offer him to the Lord. This is a tradition that goes back to the Book of Exodus. Simeon and Anna, who had waited a long time for this, and being inspired by God, recognized the Christ child as the long-awaited Savoir and spoke about Him. Today, we are in the presence of a mystery in which the Church celebrates Jesus, the Anointed One of God the Father, the firstborn of the new humanity. The Holy Family, in bringing Jesus to the Temple, was doing what the law required, the purification of the mother and the offering of the firstborn child to God and his redemption through a sacrifice. Jesus did this to be like His brothers and sisters in very way except sin for our salvation and of His complete consecration to the Father.

Jesus is the mediator between God and man. He was in fulfillment of the Law in obedience to the wishes of His Father. He was being true to the covenant. He comes as the new faithful high priest in the service of God to make expiation for the sins of the people. From the first moments of His life, Jesus was preparing for His glorious death in Jerusalem. Mary is the first person to be with Jesus on His path of obedience and their shared suffering. Mary is the carrier of the glory of God and the light to the world. St. Joseph is the faithful, quiet servant who did the will of God and protected the Holy family. Joseph and Mary taught Jesus so much about the faith, the bible, and living.

We receive much when we receive Jesus in the Eucharist. When we are told to fear not, we look to all that Jesus is, and there is good reason for patience, hope, and courage. We put this patience, hope, and courage into practice when we make Jesus visible by forgiveness and compassion in our relationships. We do this when we say thank you to people we otherwise take for granted and do not thank. When was the last time we thanked any of our public servants or first responders? When was the last time we thanked anybody for teaching us or promoting the cause of pro-life? This list goes on as well. We are called to live our lives fully for God. This feast is a special moment for the Holy Family, a special moment of hope for all.

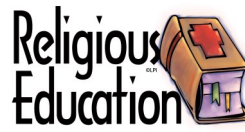
