Pastor's Message

Reflections on Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Each Sunday at Mass we listen to a reading from the Old and the New Testament as well as sing a responsorial Psalm and listen to the Gospel of the Sunday. Each Sunday the Church is teaching us how to recognize the connection between the readings and how the promises and covenants of God made in the Old Testament are revealed and fulfilled in the New Testament. Jesus Christ stands at the center of all of history. We see how God is faithful to His covenants and always desires to be with His people. When we hear the living Word of God proclaimed, our lives are united in the story of salvation history began in the Old Testament and continued in the New Testament. By virtue of our Baptism, each of us enters into the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ and His saving grace. What connections to our lives do we see in the readings? The Eucharist is all about God guiding us and giving of Himself to us out of love.

Please notice how the Gospel of today speaks about light and darkness. There are many times each of us loses our way in darkness and we miss opportunities to do good. We all wonder sometimes why we did not see things differently. There is sin and darkness all over the world that affects us and our attitudes about many things and many people. Jesus brings His message into this darkened world to save the world and all one step at a time. Notice also in today's Gospel that the four disciples Jesus invited to follow Him were all fishermen who left what they were doing to follow Jesus and help to build His kingdom. Jesus, too, calls us to follow Him and build His kingdom by how we live our lives and share His message. He invites each of us to be fishers of people one step at a time. He also tells us to look at the connection between the covenant and promises of the Old Testament and the fulfillment found in the New Testament and not be overwhelmed by the magnitude of all that needs to be done. He loves us, and He will gently guide us.

Meeting Christ in Prayer

Meeting Christ in Prayer is an eight-week guided prayer experience based on the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola. By prayer, reflection, and faith sharing, Meeting Christ in Prayer can bring people to a new level of discipleship and to a renewed sense of Christian mission.

The Meeting Christ in Prayer group meets once a week for eight weeks with Sister Anne D'Arcy. Participants pray with suggested scripture texts daily.

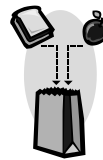
Classes will be held this Sunday, January 26th.
